Mrs. Etzler is the wife of Carl Etzler and the daughter of Warren and Nelia Summersett. She is a 1979 graduate of Lincolnview High School and is a graduate of Lima Technical College. She has appeared previously as a Gymanfa Ganu soloist.

Etzler lives in Van Wert and is pianist and organist for

Redeemer Lutheran Church in Convoy.

Mrs. Farrell, wife of Brian Farrell, is a transplant from Wisconsin where she received extensive vocal training.

She is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin-Eu Claire with a bachelor's degree in music education. She taught music in Wisconsin for six years and in Ohio for three.

Farrell lives in Van Wert and is the youth choir director for the First United Methodist Church. She is also a member of the bell and adult chairs.

Organist for the Gymanfa is Connie O'Neill and planist is Joyce Morris. Both Mrs. O'Neill and Mrs. Morris are members of the Salem Presbyterian congregation.
